

Cookies policy

The www.irrigationdesign.eu website uses cookies to provide its visitors with a better browsing experience and services tailored to each visitor's interests.

We present below the necessary information to make you aware of the details related to the placement, use and management of cookies used by the www.irrigationdesign.eu website.

Similarly, in the online environment, there are other sites, personalized pages including on third party platforms (such as Facebook) and applications accessed or used through such sites that are operated by the administrators of Smart Rain Design SRL and that use cookies as described below.

Applicability of this Policy

By using this site you consent to our use of cookies in accordance with this Cookie Policy. If you do not agree with our use of cookies, you should set your browser settings accordingly.

Disabling the cookies we use may affect your experience as a user of this site.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small files made up of letters and numbers that will be stored on a user's computer, mobile device or other equipment from which the internet is accessed.

Cookies are set by a request from a web-server to a browser (e.g. Internet Explorer, Chrome).

Cookies are completely "passive" (they do not contain software, viruses or spyware and cannot access information on the user's hard drive).

A cookie consists of 2 parts: the name and the content or value of the cookie. The lifetime of a cookie is determined; technically, only the webserver that sent the cookie can access it again when a user returns to the website associated with that webserver.

Cookies themselves do not require personal information to be used and, in most cases, do not personally identify web users.

There are 2 broad categories of cookies:

1. session cookies: these are stored temporarily in the web browser's cookie folder so that the browser remembers them until the user exits the website or closes the browser window;
2. persistent cookies: are stored on the hard drive of a computer or device and are activated again when you visit the site that created that specific cookie. Persistent cookies also include those placed by a website other than the one the user is currently visiting. These are known as "third party cookies". They remember a user's interests in order to deliver advertising that is as relevant to them as possible.

How long does a cookie last?

The lifetime of a cookie can vary significantly, depending on the purpose for which it is placed. Some cookies are intended for one-time use only (such as session cookies) and are therefore not retained once the user leaves the site. Other cookies are maintained

and reused each time the user returns to the site (persistent cookies). However, cookies can be deleted by the user at any time by using the browser settings.

What are cookies placed by third parties?

Some content sections of some sites may be provided through third party cookies such as an advertisement. Such cookies may be placed on the site and are referred to as third party cookies as they are not placed by the site owner. Such third parties are in turn obliged to comply with applicable legal regulations and the privacy policies of the owner of that site.

Why are cookies important for the internet?

Cookies are at the heart of the efficient functioning of the Internet, helping to generate a friendly browsing experience tailored to each user's preferences and interests. Refusing or disabling cookies may make some sites unusable. Refusing or disabling cookies does not mean that you will no longer receive online advertising - it just means that it will no longer be able to take into account your preferences and interests as evidenced by your browsing behaviour. Examples of important uses of cookies (which do not require a user to log in via an account):

Content and services tailored to user preferences - product and service categories;
Offers tailored to user interests - password retention;
Retention of child protection filters on Internet content (family mode options, safe search functions);
Limiting the frequency of ads - limiting the number of times an ad is shown to a particular user on a site;
Providing more relevant advertising to the user;
Measuring, optimising and Analytics features - such as confirming a certain level of traffic to a website, what type of content is being viewed and how a user gets to a website (e.g. via search engines, directly, from other websites, etc.) Websites run these usage analytics to improve their sites for the benefit of users.

What types of cookies do we use?

The following types of cookies may be placed when accessing this site:

- site performance cookies: these remember user preferences on this site;
- visitor analytics: these tell us if you have visited this site before; your browser will tell us if you have this cookie and if not, we will generate one;
- for geotargeting: these are used by software that determines which country you come from, are completely anonymous and are only used for targeting content;
- for registration: they let us know whether you are registered or not, show us the account you are registered with and whether you have permission for a particular service;
- for advertising: based on this we can find out whether or not you have viewed an online advertisement, what type of advertisement and how long it has been since you viewed this advertisement.

Do cookies contain personal data?

Cookies themselves do not require personal information in order to be used and in most cases do not personally identify internet users. Personal data may be collected through the use of Cookies only to facilitate certain functionalities for the user.

How can you change the cookie settings in your browser?

Deleting Cookies

The applications used to access web pages allow cookies to be saved on the terminal by default. These settings can be changed in such a way that the automatic management of Cookies is blocked by the web browser or the user is informed each time Cookies are sent to his terminal. Detailed information about the possibilities and modes of Cookie management can be found in the settings area of the application (web browser). Limiting the use of Cookies may affect certain functionalities of the website.

Most browsers offer the possibility to change cookie settings. These settings are usually found in the "options" or "preferences" menu of your browser.
